Foreword

This is the fifth volume of the annual statistics on children and their families. The statistics were commissioned by the Ministry of Health and Social Affairs and comprise children in the ages 0-17. These statistics are based on various registers and surveys at Statistics Sweden. The National Social Insurance Board and the National Agency for Education also provided data presented in this report. The statistics refer primarily to Sweden at the national level, but some results referring to the municipal and regional levels are also presented.

The report has been compiled by Tobias Engberg and Karin Lundström (editors), Marie Berlin, Karin Kristensson and Carita Wesslin. Hans Lundström and Åke Nilsson produced the tables from the population register at Statistics Sweden. Karin Lundström produced the register on children and families, which was one of the main data sources. The source of this register is the Total Population Register (TPR). Ingrid Sjöberg produced the tables from the Survey on living conditions
